A TREE PLANNING REVOLUTION

A Vision for Sustainability

Sarah McLeod, the headteacher of Maple Grove Academy in Manchester, can't stop praising the work of Emma Foster. "She's truly exceptional," Sarah says. Emma, who has two children at the school, is a full-time environmental officer at the city council, and three years ago, she initiated a tree planting project at the school. Initially, the project aimed to improve the environment and provide students with hands-on learning opportunities about **sustainability**.

Growing Beyond the School

Over time, Emma's vision expanded. She brought the idea of tree planting into the curriculum and encouraged the students to become "eco-leaders." The initiative quickly grew beyond the school gates, involving the local community in the planting process.

A Thriving Green Space

Today, students in every year group participate in planting trees around the school grounds. The project has not only improved the school's environment, but it has also helped to increase **biodiversity** in the local area. What began as a small idea has transformed into an extensive green space, which now includes 150 trees and a designated "wildlife area" with bird feeders and insect hotels.

Community Involvement

The local community has embraced the initiative. Neighbors often help with watering the plants, and local businesses have donated materials to support the growing project. Emma's team of eco-leaders has even started a **recycling** program that has been introduced in several other schools in the area.

Awards and Recognition

The school's **dedication** to sustainability has earned it several local environmental awards. Most recently, it won the prestigious "Green School of the Year" award, a title given by the National Green Schools Trust.

Looking to the Future

Now, Emma is hoping to secure a grant for further environmental projects. She believes the next step is to build a greenhouse for year-round plant growing. Emma's modesty shines through when she reflects on the success of the initiative: "It's about showing the children that we all have the power to make a difference. It's their future we're shaping."

A New Project on the Horizon

If the grant is secured, the students will work together to design the greenhouse. For Emma, it's another step in the school's ongoing journey toward sustainability, which she believes is crucial for both the students' education and the wider community.
